As you can see by the listing of all the Holy Days, Holidays and special days in May, the month of May is filled with a lot of special days (at least this year it is). May 9 marks forty days after Easter and the little celebrated Ascension of Our Lord. May 12 brings us to the Hallmark Card Company celebration (as

I say tongue in cheek) of Mother's Day, which we, as Christians should be on the forefront of celebrating, the joy and privilege of motherhood. Indeed, we should celebrate that God has given each of us life through our birth from our mother. We celebrate that a woman bears the image of God in that He has given her the ability to procreate as God Himself created us in the first place (and this is not the privilege given to men).

Ten days after we celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord, the day in which He returns to the place from which He descended in order to live for us, take our sins, die for us and rise, we then celebrate His sending of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday, May 19, which, this year happens to be our annual Picnic Sunday. And one week later we celebrate that we worship a Triune God, a God who gives Himself to us as three persons in one Godhead, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

At the end of the month we remember all those who have given the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom as we celebrate Memorial Day (often described as the beginning of Summer vacations). Perhaps we might do well to celebrate Memorial Day with a bit more dignity and respect as we now live in a world where fewer and fewer countries and people remain free to live in peace and according to their own beliefs (freedom of worship, speech, etc.).

Interestingly enough the month of May ends with celebrating The Visitation, that is when the angel visited Mary to announce she would be the mother of the Savior of the world. So then, it is in the month of May that we move from what we call the Festival portion of our Church Year calendar (when we celebrate the feasts of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent and Easter) to the non-Festival portion of our Church Year, and for the next twenty-seven weeks we will see the liturgical color of green, the color of growth, and spend time growing in our Christian faith and life.

I leave you with the words of King David which I pray you will make your words during these next few months and weeks, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1).


Wednesday Evenings
