St. Matthew Lutheran Church of Westfield is a congregation of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) which is a denomination that confesses the historic, orthodox Christian faith, a faith built on "the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone" (Eph. 2:20).



The LCMS, headquartered in St. Louis, Mo., is mission-oriented and Bible-based. LCMS doctrine reflects the

teachings of Dr. Martin Luther, as summarized in The Book of Concord: The Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Today, the LCMS has nearly 2 million baptized members in more than 6,000 congregations and some 9,000 pastors. Two seminaries and nine colleges and universities operate under the auspices of the LCMS, and its congregations operate the largest Protestant parochial school system in America.

Life Thoughts

January 1 – Christmas I/Circumcision and Name of Jesus – Our Lord became incarnate to give all humankind the privileges of His name (Numbers 6:27). He means to make the littlest of us into His sons and daughters (Galatians 3:26). The designation of baby Jesus as divine Child demonstrates the Father's delight in declaring infants (Psalm 8:2), eight-day-olds, and even unborn ones (Luke 2:21) as infinitely precious. Receiving them as gifts celebrates Him as God!

Stewardship Every Sunday

Luke 2:21 – "And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb." There it is: the shortest Gospel lesson of the whole Church Year. It is for the festival of the Circumcision and Name of Jesus. What more do you need to know than the name of



Jesus — "the Lord saves." That's who Jesus is: the Lord who saves us sinners. That simple Gospel message is the foundation of our faith and the strength to live out our faith.


New Board and Committee Training

Sunday School for All Ages



Poinsettias Year Round Care

<u>January - March</u> Keep poinsettias by a well-lit window and water whenever the soil feels dry.	<u>April</u> Gradually decreas watering a move into a dark room after a week or two. Keep at 60 degrees F.	<u>Mid-May</u> Re-pot and place back near a well-lit window.
<u>June</u> Move your poinsettia to a partially shaded location outside.	July Beign pinching back each new stem about 1 inch.	<u>Mid-August</u> Bring your poinsettia back inside and place by a window with direct sunlight.
<u>September</u> Continue watering and fertilizing your plant while keeping its temp above 65 degrees F.	<u>October</u> Keep your plant in total darkness from 5pm - 8am. During the day place your plant in a sunny window.	<u>November</u> In the last week of November, you should begin to see flower buds. You can now care for your poinsettia as usual.
