Associate Pastor Rev. Arturo Mendez Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The year 2020 was a difficult year and now the week of February 15 has been a difficult week. What lies ahead, no one knows and probably for good reason. Although in the beginning God created a perfect world which He described as being good, even "very good" (Gen.1:31), the human beings He created have not been good, even very good. They sinned, and their sin brought the curse. Now we live in an imperfect world, a world in which sin abounds, even a world in which the whole nature is groaning with eager expectation of the Lord's end time judgement and re-creation. However, even though we live in this imperfect world, God has promised that He is with us. He will never leave us, and He will keep this world so that "seed time and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease" (Gen. 8:22).

So, Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent came in with a bit of a dud or thud, yet the fact remains that we are now in the season of Lent. As I said last month, Lent is the season of the Church Year in which we take the time to reflect on our lives, our sins and the fact that it was because of our sin that Jesus came down from heaven, giving up the glory that was His, in order to take on human flesh and blood, to live for us, perfectly in our place, to take our sins and to suffer and die paying the eternal death penalty of hell for us. Indeed, even if we were the only person in the world, God would have shown His love for us in sending Jesus for each and every one of us personally. So much is God's love for us. Yet, we know the whole history, the rest of the history, that is of Jesus' resurrection for us.

The last Sunday in March is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Palm Sunday is also the Sunday we will confirm two of our youth and so we rejoice in their accomplishment and step in their faith life. I would encourage you to participate in the services and extra services during this Lenten season either in person at our noon or evening services or online at our evening services so that we are all better prepared for our great and grand resurrection service on Easter Sunday morning.

Devotion based on Mark 1:1

"Unless you've walked a mile in my shoes, you wouldn't understand."

Have you ever had this thought? Every day we experience troubles, trials, and temptations. Every day, most people—even those closest to us—won't know the half of it. Sometimes this is because people are too busy to ask or too self-focused to care. Other times it is because, to protect ourselves, we keep what we think and feel and experience bottled up and locked in.

But no matter who you are or what you have experienced, you have someone who knows you intimately. His name is Jesus. And he is not out of touch with your reality. He knows your triggers. He knows your turmoil. He has walked in your shoes. He went through weakness and testing in all the ways you have. He has experienced it all, except for the sin. And because he has, he can protect you.
