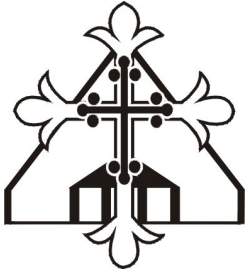


We Welcome You to St. Matthew!

St. Matthew Lutheran Church of Westfield is a congregation of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) which is a denomination that confesses the historic, orthodox Christian faith, a faith built on “the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone” (Eph. 2:20).



The LCMS, headquartered in St. Louis, Mo., is mission-oriented and Bible-based. LCMS doctrine reflects the teachings of Dr. Martin Luther, as summarized in *The Book of Concord: The Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church*. Today, the LCMS has nearly 2 million baptized members in more than 6,000 congregations and some 9,000 pastors. Two seminaries and nine colleges and universities operate under the auspices of the LCMS, and its congregations operate the largest Protestant parochial school system in America.

Evangelism ~ Why Me?

Last month we discussed what Evangelism is. This month let's take a look at why Evangelism is the privilege of every Christian. Most people run for the hills whenever a Pastor teaches or preaches about Evangelism. After all, that's not 1 of my gifts. That is someone else's job. WRONG In the Great Promise Jesus instructs His Disciples to "as you are going make disciples (those who desire to learn) of all nations" Matthew 28:19. Was that just directed at the 12 Disciples? No. Like everything else Christ taught and said these words were meant for us as well as the 12. Does that mean that we give up our chosen vocations, sell our worldly possessions and dedicate our lives to the teaching and witnessing of the Gospel to the world? Also no. While there are those men and women who God calls into Ministry as Pastors, Teachers, Deacons, Deaconesses, DECs or other areas of full time church work these words were spoken by Christ to all believers You may ask yourself, "What can I do? I am no good at talking to people, especially people I don't know?" No problem. There are many ways to "evangelize" and most of them have nothing to do with knocking on doors.

Most importantly is our "lifestyle Evangelism" that we exhibit on a daily basis. Visiting a shut in. Helping our neighbors even when they don't ask. Being in Sunday School and Bible Class and bringing our kids with us (what an awesome example to set.) Whenever we reach out in Christian love to help, aid, assist and/or correct or admonish we are exhibiting our faith in and our love for Christ and all he has done for us. We must remember however, that the reverse is also true. When we step outside our faith and do something that is contrary to God's word we are also witnessing. Getting frustrated and yelling at people in traffic especially when there are friends and/or family members in the car with us. Getting mad at the person ahead of us in the grocery line because they have 22 items in the 15 item or less aisle, the music we listen to and the shows and movies we watch all give testimony to the Witness we put forth to the world. How do you want to be perceived by those you come into contact with? Remember what Saint Paul tells us: "we are in the world, not of the world." We are chosen redeemed children of God. Does our daily witness show that? To that end Pastor Bogs will be leading us in a Witnessing Workshop on Saturday August 24th from 9 till Noon. Make plans to be there and find out what Witnessing is all about
