Associate Pastor Rev. Arturo Mendez Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year, July 4, the United States of America will be celebrating 245 years as a Democratic Republic. As was declared in 1776, so it continues today that we still maintain, "that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." And so we celebrate our freedoms; freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom from illegal search and seizure, freedom of a fair trial, freedom or right to own arms, and more.

Many denominations have debated whether or not Christians should be involved in the political process or not. in Divine Service and Bible Class; living lives as priests in the priesthood of all believers, always being ready to give and answer for the hope we have in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
