Associate Pastor Rev. Arturo Mendez Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Typically or traditionally August is the month that begins to bring us to the end of our Summer Vacations. Although Labor Day next month is often viewed as the "last hurrah of Summers," August is the time to begin getting ready for the new school year. I would like to say that the world is getting back to normal, but as the old joke goes, "what is normal?" It has been wonderful to see our church attendance getting back to what it was before the pandemic, and although I do not know how many are continuing to view our services online, I do believe one of the positives (if I may be so bold as to speak about a positive coming out of a pandemic) is that we were pretty much forced into the online streaming of our service, and we will continue to do so. Certain online services are not the ideal way of worship, but it has served well, and our prayer is that it will continue to be a way for those unable to be in Divine Service, as well as, those browsing the internet and looking for some bit of spiritual inspiration to be able to come into contact with our congregation and learn what it is that we believe, teach and confess.

Although we may not always see God's hand nor understand His plans or what is happening, we can have this confidence that whatever will be will be because of His great love for us. So as I remind myself, I will also encourage you as Paul does, "4Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. ⁵Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; ⁶do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:4-7).
