St. Matthew Lutheran Church of Westfield is a congregation of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) which is a denomination that confesses the historic, orthodox Christian faith, a faith built on “the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone” (Eph. 2:20).



The LCMS, headquartered in St. Louis, Mo., is mission-oriented and Bible-based. LCMS doctrine reflects the teachings of Dr. Martin Luther, as summarized in *The Book of Concord: The Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church*.

Today, the LCMS has nearly 2 million baptized members in more than 6,000 congregations and some 9,000 pastors. Two seminaries and nine colleges and universities operate under the auspices of the LCMS, and its congregations operate the largest Protestant parochial school system in America.

Life Thoughts



October 17 – Pentecost XXI (Proper 24B) – Surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis can indeed make anyone feel vulnerable (Ecclesiastes 5:15). Our Incarnate Almighty knows (Hebrews 4:15), and so He arranges better solutions than intentional death. His promises have power even over problems of the body (Hebrews 4:12), and whatever losses we may suffer, He more than compensates (Mark 10:29-30). About this retreat . . .

Our S.M.A.R.T. youth group is planning for Higher Things in Valparaiso, Indiana (aka "Valpo"), and we're hoping to share the transportation cost with the youth group from Zion, Tomball. Valpo will fill up fast being the most central and southern location. So we will want to get our registrations in asap. This will be July 26-29, 2022, most likely leaving the 24th and arriving home the 30th. If you want to go, get that week on your calendars now! Registration opens on November 1st. A \$150 deposit will lock in your spot. This deposit will be non-refundable unless you find someone to take your place. The total registration (not including travel) is \$435. The other \$285 is due January 31st. After that, the registration cost rises to \$460, the \$500. So, we want to start fundraising and saving early. Our first fundraiser will be THIS MONTH during our Reformation Festival on Sunday, October 31st. Be sure to plan to be there!
