Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It's that time again, it's that month again, October, it's pastor saying the same old thing again. How often do we skip things in the bulletin because "we've read that last week and week before?" Yet, even as we read and reread our Bibles which I hope and pray we are reading

and doing and how often in Bible Class do I hear and even say myself, "I don't remember reading that before". Indeed, some would suggest that every Sunday we hear that same old thing. Why do we have to hear the same old thing and why is it that the "same old thing" is repeated?

Do you remember the Children of Israel? God brought them out of Egypt with His might and power, raining down the plagues on the Egyptians, and it did not take long for them to forget and fall into their sinful ways, even worshiping a golden calf. We are really no different as sinful human beings. Indeed, we need to hear over and over again, each and every Sunday, each and every day, the good news of Jesus. We need to be reminded of our sins and the reason Jesus came because of His great love for us, lest we too forget and fall back into our sinful ways. It has been suggested that while it takes three weeks to develop a good habit, it takes only three days to lose that good habit.

With that said, it is again October, and once again we get to celebrate the Reformation of the Christian Church and the work of Dr. Martin Luther. As I say each year, Reformation Day is one of my favorite holidays because it is the day we celebrate Luther's work of bringing us back to the fullness of the Gospel, our undeserved love of God in our justification by God grace through faith in Jesus alone given to us through the means of grace His Holy Word, Holy Baptism, Holy Absolution and His Holy Supper. Indeed, as Luther so declared the Word of Scripture, "the just shall live by faith" means that we are made just and right, declared forgiven and holy in God's eyes by the faith He gives to us so that now the Holy Spirit works in us to live and do as He would have us live and do according to His good and gracious will. And as you hear me say time and again, we get it right when we point to Jesus.

I would hope and pray that instead of celebrating the secular holiday which has become known as "Halloween" from All Hallows Eve or the Eve of All Saints Day you would celebrate Reformation Day so that when you are asked what it is that you are celebrating, you will have the opportunity to share the good news, the best and greatest news of that day, the gift of salvation, by grace, through faith in Jesus alone.

If there is anything we need to hear and have the greatest desire to hear, it is the great good news of God's love for us in Jesus living for us, taking our sins, dying for us, rising for us, and giving us all the gifts and blessings He has earned and paid for: faith, forgiveness, life and eternal salvation. I pray we will never tire of hearing that Good News.

### The Lutheran Way - It Makes A Difference? (Building and Liturgy, part 4)

We have practiced what we have preached, and our preaching has informed our practice. What else is there? Again, going back to our entrance into the church building, the sanctuary as it is often called, the first thing we see is the cross of Christ, the focal point of our Divine Service. We see the focus of the Means of Grace as we see the Baptismal font, the altar, the pulpit and the communion rail. We see the separation of the nave, the main body of the church, with the chancel area, the place where the Means of Grace are most present.

What we do not see is anything that might confuse us as to what is happens in our Divine Service. We do not see anything in front of the altar, or Baptism font, or pulpit. We do not see anything in front of the cross. We do not see anything that draws our attention away from the Means of Grace and the cross of Christ. We do not see anything that might make us think we have

come to be entertained or that there is any other purpose for our being in this place except to come and be given the gifts of God through the means that He has given to us to be given those gifts.

We may have even notice our pastor covers himself with either an alb or a cassock and surplus so that he himself is not the focus of attention. As we listen to the music, we have noticed it does not get in the way of the great depth of the hymns themselves. We may have noticed the accompaniments are just that: they are there to enhance and not draw attention to themselves. Nothing draws our attention away from our purpose for being in this place at this time, to come and be given the gifts of God so we may be or are strengthened in our faith so that we may be or are able to go out into the mission field and share what we have learned and what we believe to the rest of the world in the mission field.


When the Children of Israel were rescued from their bondage of slavery in Egypt, even before they entered the promised land and while they were wandering in the wilderness, the Lord gave them instructions in how to be about being His people. His instructions were often given, not to be a burden, but to distinguish His people from the pagan nations that surrounded them, as well as, how they were to inflict His righteous judgement. His instructions were often given to live and do the opposite of those around them so there would be no doubt that they were His people. Now, while we would not say Christians in other denominations are unbelievers or non-believers or even pagan, we would understand that very often what we as Lutheran Christians do, how we practice what we preach does set us off as being different, and well it should because there are many differences in our belief that do set us apart as is seen in our practice of the Divine Service. It is these differences which are seen in how other denominations practice their own beliefs. Indeed, if we were to adopt their practices, our beliefs would be seen to be the same as theirs, and often, while they may not be condemned for such, their beliefs are not necessarily completely in line with what we believe and with what God tells us in His Word.

Next time we will look at how this comes together in our daily lives, especially in how we speak to others, how we invite them to be a part of our confession of faith, in other words, the practical application of our faith.





### Sunday School for All Ages


Preschool - Elementary Classes begin at 8:45 am in Room #5. The children are learning Biblical accounts from the Growing in Christ series.






### Sunday Adult Bible Classes
