"Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!" (Ps. 105:1; 106:1; 107:1; 118:1, 29) Notice how in four Psalms the Psalmist rejoices and gives thanks to the Lord and in Psalm 118 he does so at the beginning and the end of the Psalm. Perhaps we were raised using one of these verses as our after dinner, returning thanks prayer. Indeed, it is good to give thanks to the Lord.

Yet, how often do we think about the words we speak of thanks following our meal? How often do we actually give thanks in our prayers? Some have given the model for prayer as "ACTS" meaning Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving and Salutation. Some have suggested that our prayers should be filled with more words of thanks than petitions for blessings, and yet, as we think about our own prayers, how much of our prayers are asking and how much are giving thanks? Of course, we are reminded in the explanation to the Second Commandment, "You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God." "What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and *give thanks*." Indeed, God rejoices when we call upon His name especially in times of trouble, but even when we give thanks.

As we celebrate the secular or social holiday of Thanksgiving this year, Nov. 26, perhaps, as Christians even more so we might set aside a bit of time to actually give thanks, to think about and name the many gifts and blessings our Lord has given. From time to time our family has taken the time before our meal to go around and name one, two or three blessings for which we are thankful. As the Apostle Paul reminds us, "<sup>4</sup>Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. <sup>5</sup>Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; <sup>6</sup>do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication *with thanksgiving* let your requests be made known to God. <sup>7</sup>And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:4-7).

Even in times of struggles, in difficult times, in times of disaster, natural or manmade, there is always a reason to give thanks. God is good. God is love. God is gracious, compassionate and merciful. How can we not, give thanks to the LORD, for He is good and His mercy does endure forever.
