The Lenten Season of the Church Year begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2. The season of Lent last for forty days, not counting the Sundays because Sundays are resurrection celebration days. The liturgical color for the season of Lent is purple, the color of penitence. That is the color reminding us to be repentant of our sins and our part in

putting Jesus on the cross, the reason we celebrated Christmas and His birth. We put away our alleluias, a word meaning "praise the Lord" because the word is a joyous word, and since Lent is just about the opposite of a celebration, it makes sense that we would omit a word like this as part of a penitential practice.

As we have been doing over the past few years, during the season of Lent we will be having our mid-week, Wednesday services. Our noon service is the Service of Prayer and Preaching and begins at noon. Our evening service is Evening Prayer, the Service o Light. We will have our hymn sing at 7:15pm. If you hardly ever hear or get to hear and sing your favorite hymn, come to the hymn sing and we will sing it. What a wonderful opportunity to sing your favorite hymn and perhaps hear others you have not heard and learn new hymns. Our evening service begins at 7:30pm.

In April we will conclude our Lenten Season beginning with Palm Sunday and Holy Week, which includes our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services concluding with our joyous Easter Sonrise and Easter morning services.

Again, the season of Lent brings with it many more opportunities to come and be given the gifts that God has to give. And so I would encourage you to come and be given the gifts of God and invite others and encourage others to come as well.

Lutherans For Life 2022 Texas State Essay Contest

Sponsored by the Council of Federation Presidents

For Students in Grades 6 through 12

Any Lutheran student in a Lutheran school or church is eligible. Lutheran students may also enter through a home school or congregation, e.g. confirmation class or youth group, when validated by a pastor or teacher.

Contest Guidelines

Blessed For Life Students will write a life-affirming essay based on the theme: Blessed For Life with the Bible verse: "... the Lord protects him and keeps him alive; he is called blessed in the land; you do not give him up to the will of his enemies." Psalm 41:2.

- 1. Not incorporating the theme and verse in the essay will disqualify the entry.
- 2. Examples of topics the essay could deal with are, but are not limited to abortion, the handicapped, adoption or foster care, infanticide, cloning, stem cell research, physician assisted suicide or euthanasia etc.
- 3. Essays should include student's name, grade (school or church), and email address. This information should be submitted on the rubric page used in grading the essay.
- 4. All sources for references, statistics and quotes should be incorporated within the essay and then included in a bibliography at the end.

Grades 6 - 8 should submit essays up to 400 words

Grades 9 - 12 should submit essays up to 750 words

Entries should be submitted digitally using Microsoft Word or Google Docs to bgeistfeld@lutheransforlife.org by

April 1, 2022.

- 5. There will be a \$100 first place award and \$50 second place award for each of the two categories. The two first place category winners will advance to the national contest. Email bgeistfeld@lutheransforlife.org with any questions.
- 6. Grand prize for the national winning entry at each level: \$250 plus free conference registration to the 2022 Lutherans For Life National conference and one night stay at the conference hotel.
