At Calvary it was achieved but not given out. Here

it is not achieved but it is given you. As the Small Catechism confesses, the two chief things are the bodily eating and drinking of the body and blood of Christ and the words for you. *Into mouth and into faith; unfaith can repudiate the gift, but it cannot make the Lord's words untrue. It can profane his body and blood to mortal consequence.* – Dr. Norman Nagel

Stripping of the Altar (Evening Service Only)................ Psalm 22 Immediately after the Post Communion Prayer and after the candles have been extinguished, the communion vessels are reverently removed, and the altar is stripped in preparation for the solemn services of Good Friday. While this is done, the congregation will read responsively Psalm 8. All leave the church silently.

## Our Practice of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

The sacrament of the Lord's Supper which we celebrate today "is appropriately called the Food of the Soul since it nourishes and strengthens the new man" (Luther). Scripture teaches and we Lutheran Christians believe that:

the very Body and Blood of Jesus are truly present in and with the bread and wine.

 all who partake of this Sacrament there receive Christ's very Body and Blood (1 Cor. 11:24-26).

we are to come to the Lord's table prepared: a man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup (1 Cor. 11:28).

one who eats and drinks this Holy Food while denying Christ's Real Presence and the benefits of blessings of the Sacrament eats and drinks judgement upon himself (1 Cor. 11:29).

★ the common reception of this Holy food is also a declaration of doctrinal oneness (Acts 2:42).

Accordingly, St. Matthew Lutheran Church of Westfield exercises the most loving, biblical and spiritual practice of Closed communion, communing only those of our fellowship. The intent of this practice is not to offend, but to honor and obey the Word of Christ. We, therefore, ask those who are not communicant members in good standing of St. Matthew to please speak with our pastor prior to partaking of the Lord's Supper. Guests who are communicant members of another Missouri Synod congregation and who have previously spoken to our pastor need only sign the Record of Fellowship. Children and individuals not partaking of the Lord's Supper are invited to come forward during the distribution to receive a spoken blessing. Please keep your hands beneath the communion rail to indicate you will not be receiving the sacrament. *All participants of the Lord's Supper are encouraged to review "Christian Questions with Their Answers" from Luther's Small Catechism found on page 329 of your hymnal.* 

For those who have not espoused the doctrine of the Lutheran Church and wish to receive the body and blood of Jesus as He reveals Himself to us in this Blesses Sacrament, inform our pastor of your desire, and he will assist you.

We trust that all will understand and respect this belief and practice. Although we cannot offer a general invitation to the Lord's Supper, we invite you to join us in fervent prayer that God will exert His might to bring all churches into blessed unity of doctrine and practice.

The Distribution & Reception

- Before partaking of the Lord's Supper, we ask that you read the above statement of our practice of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- Communicants come forward by the center aisle and return by the side aisles.
- Mon-communicants and children are invited to come forward for a blessing, please keep palms down to indicate you will not be receiving the sacrament.
- Communicants who prefer the individual cup, please wait for the elder administering the Chalice or common cup to direct you to partake of the wine.
- The center individual cups are filled with non-alcoholic wine if you so desire.
- Communicants who prefer the Chalice, or common cup, please tip the bast of the chalice to assist the elder.
