

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As per usual April newsletter beginning: March winds bring April showers bring May flowers, or so the adage goes. I am not sure if that is always true, but I do know that this year April brings us to the second festival part of our Church Year Calendar, Holy Week. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday as we celebrate Jesus' last and

triumphant entrance into Jerusalem when we sing our Hosannas to our King. The custom here at St. Matthew is that Palm Sunday is also our usual Confirmation Sunday, but as this year we do not have any of our youth read, we will continue this custom next year, and if the Lord wills, we will have five of our youth ready for Confirmation.

For me personally, and as I have encouraged in every parish in which I have served, Holy Week is best honored by our commitment to focusing on the events of each day. As I have done so in the past, so this year I will provide a reading list for each of the days of Holy Week (see pages in this newsletter). Also, I have encouraged all boards and committees and even all the volunteer groups with which I am associated to not schedule meetings for Holy Week so that we can contemplate on what Jesus did for us.

Holy week begins on Palm Sunday and then picks up on Maundy Thursday. When speaking with my friends from other denominations who do not recognize the sacraments, I ask if they know what Jesus was celebrating when He gave us His Holy Supper. He was celebrating the Jewish Passover Festival and from that celebration He has given us a new Supper, His Holy Supper, the Lord's Supper. Thus, on Maundy Thursday we will celebrate the Lord's Supper, and at the end of the evening service we will strip the altar in preparation for the following day, Good Friday.

On Good Friday we have the opportunity once again to be reminded of our part in Jesus' suffering and enduring the death penalty of hell for us, in our place. We will have our evening tenabrae service and carry the cross to the cemetery to conclude that service.

On Saturday we will prepare the sanctuary for our Easter morning joy-filled celebrations of Jesus' resurrection.

Of course, this year we will offer our noon services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and we will hear once again on Maundy Thursday how the Thursday service begins with an invocation but does not end with a benediction, how the Good Friday service has not invocation nor benediction and how our Easter Sonrise service has no invocation. The meaning of this custom is that the three services are to be understood as a continuation of one service ending in our joyous Resurrection celebration.

I especially encourage you to be at both services on Easter Sunday because the Sonrise service does not afford the opportunity to be given the Lord's gifts through His Holy Supper and because the two services have different messages, messages which complete our series on the "I AM" words of Jesus. As always, I would encourage you to take advantage of all the extra opportunities to come and be given the gifts that God gives.
