St. Matthew Lutheran Church of Westfield is a congregation of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) which is a denomination that confesses the historic, orthodox Christian faith, a faith built on “the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone” (Eph. 2:20).

The LCMS, headquartered in St. Louis, Mo., is mission-oriented and Bible-based. LCMS doctrine reflects the teachings of Dr. Martin Luther, as summarized in The Book of Concord: The Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Today, the LCMS has nearly 2 million baptized members in more than 6,000 congregations and some 9,000 pastors. Two seminaries and nine colleges and universities operate under the auspices of the LCMS, and its congregations operate the largest Protestant parochial school system in America.

Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God’s family, the church, in managing all of life and life’s resources for God’s purposes.

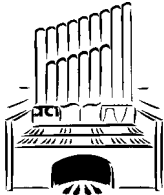

Are you an aspiring filmmaker or know someone who is? Make plans now to participate in Concordia Seminary, St. Louis' new short film competition as part of its annual Faith and Film Festival being held Jan. 26-28, 2023.

Amateur filmmakers at least 18 years of age are invited to submit their films to the contest starting June 30. The submission deadline is Oct. 15 and finalists will be notified by Dec. 15. The submission fee is \$25 per entry.

Films should be based on the theme of "Faith" and run 10 minutes or less. Entries may be of any genre or style, such as narrative, experimental, animation or documentary. Full competition details are available online. Faithandfilm@csl.edu

Four films will be selected as finalists and will be screened during the festival. A jury of film critics, producers, scholars and professors will select the top films based on technique, storytelling and representation of the theme. One film festival pass will be awarded to each of the four finalists.

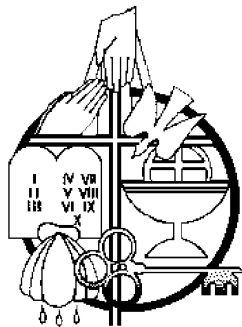

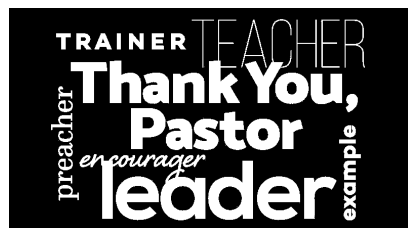
Date: July 24, 2022
