Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

September is a wonderful month or at least one in which we look forward especially to the fact that Fall or Autumn begins on September 22. After quite a hot Summer and one I believe compares to the one I still remember back in 1981 or 82 we are certainly looking forward to cooler weather. Of course, we are not looking for such cool weather as we had last year when we were frozen for a week. Certainly, if anything, the fluctuations in weather remind us that we do live in a fallen, sin-cursed world,

and while many would look to human reasoning to explain our world, I would encourage you to always go back to what God says knowing that His Word is true and is a Word with authority. 


ESL Classes
